As part of Emory Campus Life's continued efforts to support student flourishing, Campus Life is expanding key resources during the period between fall semester examinations and the start of the spring term ('Winter Break', for short). The Atlanta and Clairmont campuses will remain open during Winter Break for students currently living in Emory campus residence halls, with a spring 2024 housing agreement, and who need continuous housing during the break.

### **Winter Break Housing**

Students who need to remain on-campus through Winter Break on either the Atlanta or Clairmont campuses **must** register prior to the break. No additional cost will be assessed to students for Winter Break housing.

- Registration for Winter Break Housing will open November 1.
- All terms of the Housing Agreement, Residence Life and Housing Policies, and Emory University Policies will remain in effect during Winter Break.

### **Moving Out at the End of Fall Semester**

Students with a housing agreement that terminates at the end of the fall 2023 semester are expected to move out of the residence halls by **12 p.m. (noon) on Friday, December 15**. This includes students graduating at the end of the fall 2023 semester, studying abroad in spring 2024, or not enrolled for the spring 2024 semester.
